Joy & Sorrow - Pain into Purpose

Mr. Searle, I beg you to create a new life for yourself. Be the son, brother, uncle, nephew your family longs for you to be. I don't know if you have children. If you do, you owe them to be a dad who loves and provides for them. Children shouldn't have to witness dysfunction in the home, visit their dad in jail or watch them choose drugs over them. As my husband shared with you, we forgive you. We urge you to seek Jesus while you serve out your new sentence.

I work for a large homeless shelter in Knoxville. I see people struggling every day. People whose lives of addiction have cost them everything, people held captive my mental illness brought on most often by years of drug abuse. I see generational poverty and addiction. There have been many days, when the scenes I see on the streets near our mission, are hard to bear. I see so many young men struggling, I see you, the drug dealer, and I see too many Tyler's.

But I also see people eager for change and I see men and women being freed and restored to themselves, their families and their communities.

This is why I also supported Tyler going to faith-based recovery programs. I know the good work that goes on inside rescue missions across the country and right here in Nashville, I've visited the Nashville Rescue Mission before. Shelters like ours provide not only emergency services like meals and shelter, they also provide life-saving recovery programs. Tyler went to three of them over the years.



Faith & Fear: Anointed To Prove Hell Wrong

NAVIGATING FAITH AMIDST FEAR

Saul replied, 'You are not able to go out against this Philistine and fight him; you are only a young man, and he has been a warrior from his youth. (1 Samuel 17:33)

The king and his men marched to Jerusalem to attack the Jebusites, who lived there. The Jebusites said to David, 'You will not get in here; even the blind and the lame can ward you off.' They thought, 'David cannot get in here. (2 Samuel 5:6)

1. Remove Saul's Armor

Then Saul dressed David in his own tunic. He put a coat of armour on him and a bronze helmet on his head. 39 David fastened on his sword over the tunic and tried walking around, because he was not used to them. I cannot go in these, he said to Saul, 'because I am not used to them.' So he took them off.

(1 Samuel 17:38-39)

1. Remove Saul's Armor

- Cannot fight giants with someone else's anointing
- Cannot fulfill my destiny with someone else's identity
- Cannot succeed with someone else's promises

2. Get Fresh Oil

So Samuel took the horn of oil and anointed him in the presence of his brothers, and from that day on the Spirit of the LORD came powerfully upon David.

(1 Samuel 16:33)

When all the elders of Israel had come to King David at Hebron, the king made a covenant with them at Hebron before the LORD, and they anointed David king over Israel.

(2 Samuel 5:3)

2. Get Fresh Oil


